National Day of Mourning April 28 at 7:00pm at Shrine Hill, Wilno

April 28 is observed across Canada as the National Day of Mourning, a day to honour those who have died, suffered injury or experienced illness due to work-related causes.

Why April 28?

On that day in 1914, the Workmen's Compensation Act was given third reading in the Ontario Legislature. It was made official in Canada by an act of Parliament. In 1984, April 28 was established as a Day of Mourning by the Canadian Labour Congress. This was a day



to mourn for the dead and fight for the living. In 1991 the Canadian federal government passed legislation making April 28 as the National Day of Mourning for persons killed, injured or suffered illness in the workplace. This has since become an International movement. The International Labour Organization celebrates the World Day of Safety

and Health at work on April 28 to promote the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally. Recognition of this event arrived in **Renfrew** County in 2000 with the establishment of a monument in Pembroke. followed in 2001 by the placement of a memorial in the Town of Renfrew. Then a few local people in the town of Wilno erected a monument in 2004 on Shrine Hill. On April 28, a Day of Mourning event will be held at 7:00pm at the Shrine Hill monument.

2018 MUNICIPAL/SCHOOL BOARD TRUSTEE ELECTION

Monday, October 22, 2018 is Election Day for municipalities and School Board Trustees across the Province of Ontario. For the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards the following positions may be available to vote for depending upon the nomination papers that are filed on or before Nomination Day.

- Mayor (1 position)
- Councillor (6 positions)
- School Board Trustee (English Public and English Catholic)
- School Board Trustee (French Public and French Catholic)

Am I eligible to vote?

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality, if on Voting Day, he or she is:

- a Canadian citizen
- at least 18 years of age
- resides within the municipality or is an owner or tenant of land there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant and is not otherwise prohibited from voting.

Who can be a Candidate?

Any eligible elector may be a candidate for the position of Mayor or Councillor. School Board Trustees must be eligible electors of their own school board.

Nomination Period – When and where can I file a nomination paper for the position of Mayor or Councillor?

An eligible elector may file a nomination paper with the Clerk during regular office hours when the Clerk's Office is open from Tuesday, May 1, 2018 until Thursday, July 26, 2018.

On Friday, July 27, 2018 which is Nomination Day, a nomination paper may be filed in the Clerk's Office from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. The onus is on the candidate to file a complete nomination paper with the correct fee. The fee for the position of Mayor is \$200.00 payable in cash, certified cheque or money order. The fee for the position of Councillor is \$100.00 payable to the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards in cash, certified cheque or money order. An important change for the 2018 Municipal Election is the requirement to have 25 eligible electors from the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards to endorse and sign your nomination paper when you submit the same to the Clerk.

Marriage Licence Requirements

If you are getting married this year, you will need a marriage licence. The Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards issues marriage licences. You need to make an appointment to obtain your licence and you need to bring the following: a completed Marriage Licence Application Form (available in the office or on our website), you and your spouse will each need two pieces of ID and you need to pay the prescribed fee of \$75. If either party is divorced, a copy of the original divorce decree is also required. The licence is valid for three months from the date of issue. Fire Safety Tips

Wood heat

- · Burn dry, well-seasoned wood to reduce risk of excessive creosote build-up.
- Store wood outdoors, stacked in an open area or shed away from the house to provide good air-flow to assist drying.
- Check chimneys and flue pipes often for creosote and soot build up and keep clean to prevent chimney fires.
- Maintain a proper cap on top of chimneys to protect against damage from rain or snow.
- Inspect spark screens on chimney caps regularly to make sure smoke can vent properly.
- Keep combustible materials a safe distance away from woodstoves and fireplaces.
- Always use a properly fitting screen for fireplaces to keep sparks and embers contained.
- Allow ashes from woodstoves or fireplaces to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Install working smoke alarms on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas to alert you to a fire in your home. Develop and practice a home fire escape plan with your family.
- Install a carbon monoxide alarm to alert you to the presence of deadly carbon monoxide gas.

How to Prevent Electrical Fires Safety Tips

- Check cords for damage such as fraying or nicks. A damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.
- Avoid running cords under rugs, which can damage the cord and cause a fire.
- Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection. If permanent wiring is required, have additional outlets installed by a licensed electrician. Extension cords should not be linked together use an extension cord that is long enough to do the job.
- · Air conditioners and other heavy appliances should be plugged directly into an outlet.
- Avoid overloading a circuit with "octopus outlets". If additional outlets or circuits are required, have them installed by a licensed electrician

Fire Safety for Farms and Rural Properties

- Check with the Fire Chief (613) 401-6982 for regulations before any open burning.
- Install and maintain lightning rods and grounding cables on barns and silos to give lightning a direct path to follow to ground, keeping barns and livestock safe.
- Keep property numbers visible and prominently posted to help emergency responders locate your property.
- Store hazardous products like herbicides and fertilizers in dry, well-ventilated areas according to manufacturer's recommendations and applicable regulations.
- Refuel machinery and equipment outdoors away from potential ignition sources like open flames or sparks.
- Enforce a 'NO SMOKING' policy in and around all farm buildings and post 'NO SMOKING' signs in prominent locations.
- Ensure that electrical installations and repairs are done by licensed electricians.
- Carry out regular inspections of electrical and mechanical systems for corrosion or malfunction that may cause a fire.
- Install and maintain working smoke alarms on every storey and outside all sleeping areas of your home.
- Develop a home fire escape plan and practise it with all members of the household.
