Lending Hub Debuts in KHR

Lending Library coming soon!

Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards will soon be home to an Equipment Lending Library, as part of a Renfrew County Healthy Kids Community Challenge initiative. The goal is to make a wide assortment of recreation and leisure equipment available to the community. This accessibility to equipment, plus accompanying programs and activities for children and youth, encourage families to be more active, and more healthy.

Families, organizations and schools will have access to the sporting goods to be stored in Round Lake and Killaloe.

To borrow the equipment, simply visit the Killaloe and District Public Library. With a library card in good standing you can borrow equipment for a one



week period. Once borrowed from the library, the equipment is picked up at one of the two locations in the township and is returned to the same location one week later.

Baseball, lacrosse, yard games, bocce, horse shoes, soccer balls and nets are just a few of the items available. The equipment library will be expanded with winter items in the fall.

The Community Resource Centre also has a variety of recreation items available for

lending. For more information about their equipment library call 613-757-3108.

This is a great opportunity for our community to become or remain active and to lead healthy lifestyles. The KHR Equipment Lending Hub has also been established to help eliminate barriers that may prevent individuals from

participating in sport and leisure activities.

Finally, make sure you drink plenty of water when you are physically active or playing sports.

Recycling Changes

Some new items accepted in recycling

There are some changes to your recycling service in the township due to changes at the processing facility for recyclable materials.

Styrofoam can no longer be included with your blue box recyclables. Please dispose of styrofoam with your household waste.

Please continue to sort your recyclables at the source for curbside pick-up as well as for processing at waste sites.

Items in Group 1 can be recycled together. Items in Group 2 can be recycled together.

Recyclables Group 1

- Drink and food cans, aluminum plates, foil
- Empty paint cans (no plastic, empty)
- #1 and #2 plastic bottles (food & beverages only)



- #2, #3, #5, #7 and jugs (food and beverage only)
- #2 and #5 plastic tubs/lids
- Cartons (milk/juice cartons)
- Tetra packs (including drinking boxes)
- Plastic margarine containers, yogurt containers and other plastic food containers
- Clear/coloured glass (food and beverage only)

- #4 plastic film (including grocery and shopping bags and the outer wrap from cases of water, toilet paper, paper towels and milk bags)
- New: #4 plastic film now includes bread bags. Place all plastic film in one bag (a bag of bags).

Recyclables Group 2

- Office mixed paper
- Newspaper, flyers, magazines, junk mail
- Catalogues, writing paper, telephone directories
- Box board: cereal boxes, cookie boxes, cracker boxes and cardboard egg cartons, egg cartons (cardboard)
- Brown paper bags, dog/cat kraft bags
- Plain wrapping paper and tissue paper. No Christmas or wrapping paper with a printed design.
