Opeongo Hills Nordic Ski Club

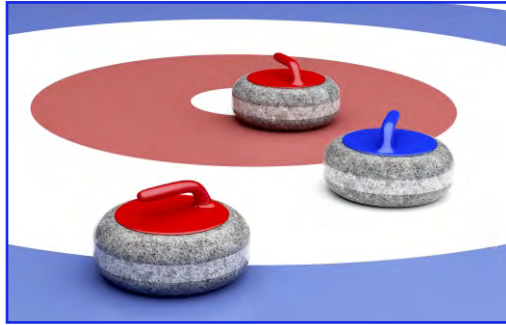

The deadline for the Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) Program is fast-approaching. The final day for applying is January 20, 2017.

The Government of Canada has been accepting applications for the Canada Summer Jobs Program since mid-December.

For many years, Canada Summer Jobs has been helping employers create much-needed

summer job opportunities for students, while strengthening local economies and communities across Canada.

Funding opportunities are available to not-for-profit organizations, public-sector employers and small businesses with 50 or fewer employees under the CSJ program.

Applicants must create

summer job opportunities for young people aged 15 to 30 years, who are full-time students intending to return to their studies in the next school year.

Marriage Licence Requirements

If you are getting married this year, you will need a marriage licence. The Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards issues marriage licences. You need to make an appointment to obtain your licence and you need to bring the following: a completed Marriage Licence Application Form (available in the office or on our website), you and your spouse will each need two pieces of ID and you need to pay the prescribed fee of \$75. If either party is divorced, a copy of the original divorce decree is also required. The licence is valid for three months from the date it is issued.
