Here is a brief overview of their time here at Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards.

**Janice Tidje:** First elected to the municipality of the Village of Killaloe in 1985, Janice served as Reeve for 15 years before becoming Mayor of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards after the amalgamation in 2000. In total Janice served for 37 years and is noted as being one of the longest serving members of Renfrew County Council. Over her many terms, Janice helped initiate many large community projects including the Bonnechere River Water Management Project and she is also well known for her role as Warden of Renfrew County from 2007 - 2008. Thank you, Janice, for your many years of service.

**Debbie Peplinskie:** First elected in 2000, Debbie served as Councillor for 22 years on the first elected council of Killaloe Hagarty and Richards. Known for her animal activism and strong community involvement, we wish her all the best and thank her for her many years of service to our community.

**John Jeffrey:** First elected in 2010, John served as Councillor for 12 years. His knowledge of local history and forestry has been extremely beneficial over his terms and his work to help establish the KHR Loggers Sports Festival has been deeply appreciated.

**Stanley Pecoskie:** First elected in 2000, Stanley served as Councillor for 22 years and was also one of the first elected members of the municipality of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards. Stanley is well known for his work to establish the KHR Loggers Sports Festival and his knowledge of waste management has greatly benefited our community.

# Killaloe Pathways Park

After many months of hard work, the Municipality of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards alongside its many community partners is pleased to announce the completion of the trail systems and installations at Killaloe Pathways Park located at 86 Queen Street in Killaloe! Though generous donations from our community and successful grant funding, this project has been thoughtfully completed through partnerships and collaborations with zero cost to the ratepayers of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards! The trail is now open to walk, snowshoe and ski depending on conditions over the winter months, with a grand opening event planned for the spring of 2023! Here are all the exciting things you can look forward to at your Killaloe Pathways Park:

## The Main Trail System

The Main Trail System consists of two stone dust pathways with 2-meter-wide trails winding through a diverse landscape over a kilometer in distance. Here you will find our Reading Trail and our Fitness Trail equipped with benches for resting along the way and welcome boards at the trail heads. Waste collection bins and signage will be installed in the spring of 2023.



## Fitness Trail

The Fitness Trail is the smaller loop of the Main Trail System and is roughly 0.4 kilometers long. Along the trail you will find 10 Fitness Stations where you can do various calisthenics workout activities utilizing your own body weight and the station equipment. Signage for these stations will be installed in the spring of 2023.



## Greenhouse

The Greenhouse is a project spearheaded by the Killaloe Community Resource Centre and will look to improve food sustainability while also providing space for community gardening. Power and water are currently being installed and plans to install community gardens are scheduled for spring of 2023.



## Reading Trail

The Reading Trail is the outer, larger loop of the Main Trail System and is roughly 0.6 kilometers long. Along the trail you'll find 18 reading stations which will have a children's story featured 4 times a year, with a new story for each season. Each station will have two pages of a book with suggested activities designed to engage children in the words and the illustrations.



## Orchard Trail

The Orchard Trail is a stand-alone trail that connects the Greenhouse to the side lot along the driveway of the park. Here, with help from the CRC we have planted fruit bearing trees along a roughly 0.5-kilometer trail. These trees will help provide increased food sustainability as well as shade for present and future generations! A community consultation process planned for the winter of 2023 will ask local residents to help plan future park development.



## Junior Rangers Program

We are delighted to announce the establishment of the Killaloe Pathways Park Junior Rangers Program! This program empowers our elementary school aged children to become stewards of the park, and currently involves partnering with our two local elementary schools in Killaloe. Currently we have created the “Imagine Killaloe Pathways Park Contest” where we have asked students to imagine their dreams for the park’s future be it a new installation, art work or program. The top 9 designs from each school will be showcased inside the reading stations during the winter and will be considered for future development of the park!

**The Future of KPP:** Over the winter months we will be working hard on signage and the future development of the park. This will include plans for a community consultation seminar as well as other initiatives like expansion of our Junior Rangers Program, Accessible Washroom, and Legacy Bench program. We hope to have this all ready for our grand opening in spring of 2023!

**Signage:** KPP is committed to providing signage in three languages, English, French and Anishinaabemowin. Over the winter, we will be finalizing wording and creating signs for deployment in 2023.

**Accessible Washroom:** KPP has received grant funding to develop a 3-season Accessible Washroom, with availability to turn 4-season in future developments. Plans and designs will be finalized during the winter, with construction starting in spring of 2023.

**Legacy Bench Program:** KPP will be launching a “Legacy Bench Program” over the winter to commemorate and honor members of our community with a permanent bench installation in the park. Benches can be purchased by families, donated by businesses or purchased on behalf of individuals

and a tax credit will be provided by the municipality. This program will launch in early 2023.

**Reading Station Sponsorship:** KPP will also be recruiting yearly sponsors for our Reading Stations which will be launched in the spring of 2023. Yearly station sponsorships can be purchased by individuals, families or businesses and interested parties should reach out via email for more information.

**Community Consultation:** As part of our vision to create a park for everyone with community at heart, we are planning a community consultation meeting

in early January of 2023. We invite the public to join us on this exciting journey in helping develop the future of Killaloe Pathways Park. Stay tuned for more details.
