Regular Meeting

Council for the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards met on the above date with Mayor David Mayville and Councillors Harold Lavigne, Bil Smith, Carl Kuehl, Ted Browne and Brian Pecoskie in attendance.

Call to Order:

Mayor Mayville chaired the meeting which he opened and called to order.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Council for the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards hereby adopts the agenda for the Regular Council meeting of August 4, 2026, as presented. Carried.

First Nations Land Acknowledgement:

First Nations Land Acknowledgement read by Mayor Mayville.

Moment of Silent Reflection:

Mayor Mayville requested a moment of silent reflection.

Mayor's Address:

Mayor Mayville provided an update on recent events attended on behalf of the Township, including the RLPOA AGM, a OTF grant announcement and a Public Meeting regarding the ward system and council composition.

Pecuniary/Financial Interest:

No pecuniary/financial interest was declared.

Delegation:

Prior to Mr. Eckert's presentation, Councillor Browne advised that the KHR Firefighters were in attendance to request permission to host an open house and indicated that Council approval was not required, after which Mr. Eckert was invited to address Council. Mr. Eckert advised Council that KHR Firefighters Association would be hosting an open house on August 23, 2026 from approximately 11:00 am to 4:00 pm and provided some details to the event.

Council thanked Mr. Eckert and Mr. Gibson for their attendance at which time they left the meeting.

Mr. Scott Gardner, President of the RLPOA, was in attendance and invited to address Council. Mr. Gardner provided an update on the CD3 Boat Cleaning Machine, advising that it was operational on June 4th, and he presented system software analytics, including usage data and graphs, and provided the anticipated purchase cost following the season and potential fundraising efforts should Council wish to move forward with partnering in the purchase. Mr. Gardner thanked Council for its continued support.

Council raised questions regarding the CD3 Boat Cleaning Machine, including the lifespan of zebra mussels, maintenance requirements, positive and negative feedback received regarding the machine, and the number of individuals using the machine. Council also inquired whether data is available regarding the number of boats coming out of Round Lake without using the machine. Mr. Gardner advised that the machine does not have the capability to collect this information. Council further asked where the data is sent following the purchase of the data package. Mr. Gardner advised that, for an annual fee of \$1,200, the data package would be provided to the individual or organization responsible for paying the fee.

Council thanked Mr. Gardner for his presentation.

The Council of Canadians Kitchissippi-Ottawa Valley Co-Chair & Animator Ann Pohl was in attendance and invited to address Council. Ms. Pohl presented a request regarding the Walk for the Water event to be held on October 12, 2026, in partnership with The Circle of

Turtle Lodge. The request included Council support for the initiative, promotion of the event through the Township's online calendar and poster display, and a Council representative providing greetings at the post-walk gathering. Council supported Ms. Pohl's requests; however, no resolution was passed.

Reports:

Facilities/Asset Manager Dale Thompson was in attendance and invited to provide his report. Facilities/Asset Manager reported that three quotes were received for the Station Park retaining wall project RFP-02-2026. Facilities/Asset Manager Thompson advised that Crosstown Construction Inc. submitted the quote of \$86,500 plus HST of \$11,245 for a total cost of \$97,745; Yantha Backhoe & Trucking Ltd. submitted a quote of \$88,407.08 plus HST of \$11,492.92 for a total quote of \$99,900.00; and RK Porter General Contracting submitted a quote of \$112,765.52 plus HST of \$14,659.51 for a total quote of \$127,425.03. Facilities/Asset Manager noted that all quotes were for a stone wall and recommended Crosstown Construction Inc. to complete the project.

Mayor Mayville noted that there did not appear to be any loss of space and inquired whether the railing would be fastened on top of the stone or installed on the inside. Facilities/Asset Manager Thompson advised that he would need to obtain further clarification from Crosstown Construction Inc. on this matter; however, he noted that most railing systems are attached on the top of the stone.

Councillor Kuehl inquired if the steps would be replaced to which Facilities/Asset Manager Thompson advised that the steps were not part of the RFP.

Councillor Browne inquired about the cost comparison between using timber and stone. Facilities/Asset Manager Thompson advised that he did not have an actual cost comparison available; however, he noted that pressure-treated lumber has an estimated lifespan of approximately 10 years.
